Across affected communities, essential services are scarce, increasing the vulnerabilities of internally displaced persons, especially in health care, nutrition, clean water, sanitation, hygiene, and protection services.



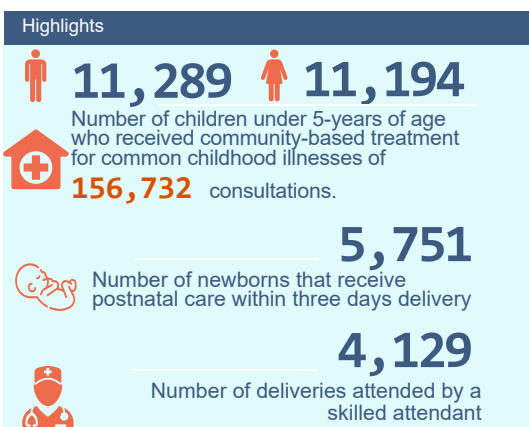
Facts and figures



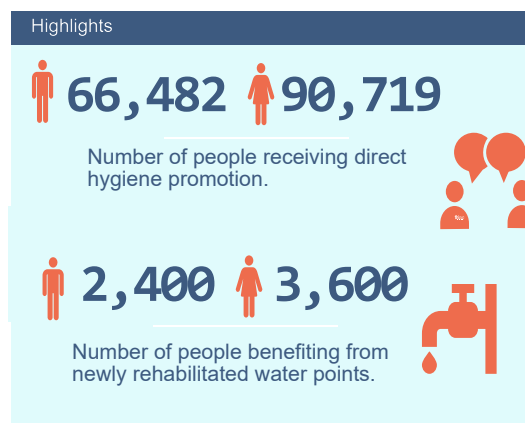
More than **8 million** people are affected and need assistance across the BAY states, with the highest number in Borno state.

Continuing the gain of IHANN I-II, FHI 360 recorded significant progress against planned objectives, activities, and indicators from January 1st, 2021, to January 31st, 2022, for the **Integrated Humanitarian Assistance to Northeast Nigeria (IHANN III)** project. FHI 360's IHANN III health, gender-based violence (GBV) and child protection, water, sanitation and hygiene (WASH) and nutrition sectors, provided a set of integrated services that comprehensively supported internally displaced persons (IDPs). Thus, reducing risks of morbidity and mortality and contributing to the improved well-being of displaced and conflict-affected individuals in Bama Town and Banki-Bama, Damasak-Mobbar, Dikwa, and Ngala LGAs of Borno state. 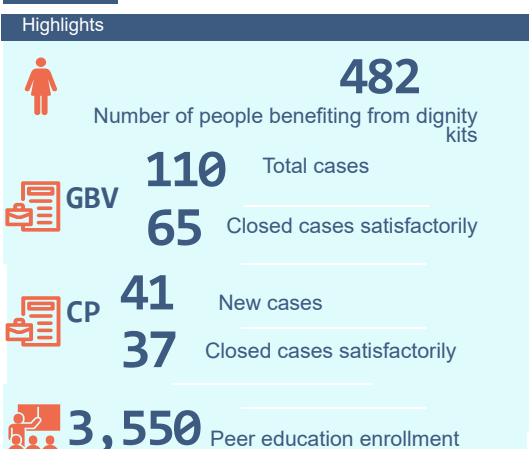
